Mission Beach SES lights the way

The Mission Beach State Emergency Service can now carry out emergency work at night with the acquisition of a Lunar Lighting Tower System.

SES members sold raffle tickets each Saturday at the Mission Beach Resort and fundraised over \$10,000 to purchase the new lighting equipment.

SES member Sue Bachl

said the light will help other emergency organisations and will be readily available.

"At least this light is in our area if something happens," Ms Bachl said.

"The light was one of the things we needed most when we became operational in September 2006.

"It can be used in all types of weather and that's

the beauty of this light."

The light tower will also assist the Police, Queensland Fire and Rescue Service and the Queensland Ambulance Service during after dark emergencies.

The two kilowatt Glare Free Lunar Lighting Tower provides 360 degrees of night working light up to 100 metres.
